



#### **Church & Society: Love the Other Edition**

I opened the first 2024 Church & Society meeting in January with a devotional about seeing God in each person we encounter. I talked about how I have Hebrews 13:2 framed on my desk at the library - "Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." – as a reminder that each person I cross paths with at the library is a child of God. This includes the man who smells bad because he's experiencing homelessness and lives on the street; the custodian emptying the trash cans who doesn't speak any English; the customer who requests a copy of *Mein Kampf*. We talked about how when we see people, really see them as a beloved child of God, we're more inclined to want to work towards justice for them.

In response to our February meeting, I re-read Bishop Will Willimon's book Fear of the Other. This book challenged me to do more than see God in others, but to love the other, to let go of my fear of the other. And each of us has an "other" – the immigrant, the homeless, those belonging to a different political party, the person down the pew with different theological beliefs, the disabled, the addicted, the unemployed, and the list could go on. Yet Jesus calls us to live as one body (1 Corinthians 12:12–27) and to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mark 12:30–31). I've found that to be much easier in theory than in practice; maybe you have to.

So what are we going to do about it?

Join Church & Society at 9am on Sundays in June for discussion based on Bishop Willimon's book Fear of the Other. No Fear in Love. We'll meet in the dining room for prayer, study of scripture, and discussion about how God is calling us to love the other. In Fear of the Other, Willimon says: "First John challenges us to see others differently, not denying our differences but opening ourselves to what is good, asking what God might have to teach us through each other. In other words, we are hereby urged to look at others as God in Christ has looked upon us" (12).

When: Sundays in June, 9am-9:45am June 2, 9, 16, 23, and 30 Where: TRUMC Dining Room in the Leisure Ministries building

What: large & small group discussion about how God is calling us to love the other using Fear of the Other as a quide (a limited number of copies of the book will be available on June 2)

Who: You! All of us together, led by Church & Society members and other congregation members Why: When we actively work to tear down the walls dividing us, we are more likely to build a bridge in its place – bringing us closer to seeing the other as another child of God. Through the love of God at work in each of us, the world is changed – we are changed, the way we see and interact with the other is changed and the mission of the church – to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world – takes place.

Join Church & Society this year as we celebrate the unity of the body of Christ while recognizing our differences and find ways to embody the love of God to the other, whoever that other might be for each of us. We look forward to learning, listening, and loving as God first loved us.


#### **TRUMC Library**
